# LL.M Course Regulation under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) Master of Law:

(4 semesters/ 2 years): LL.M

- 1. Each semester shall extend over a minimum period of 18 weeks including examination days.
- 2. Eligibility for admission :

Candidates possessing a degree of University of Mysore or any other University equivalent thereto and complying with the eligibility criteria shown as detailed below:

LL.B 5 years / 3 years: Minimum 45% of marks of aggregate of 5 years / 3 years Examination (Minimum 40% for SC/STs)

#### 3. Scheme of Instruction:

In each semester there will be 5 papers. The instruction method shall comprise of lecture method, tutorial method and practical method depending on the requirement of each course. The LTP model of 3:1:0 or 2:1:1 may be adopted. There shall be 4 credits for each paper.

The Department offers a Dissertation / project work; it shall be in lieu of a paper. Dissertation shall be offered during the Fourth Semester. The Dissertation shall carry 100 marks comprising of both Internal Assessment and Internal Evaluation. The Internal component is comprising of 2 presentations before submission of Dissertation and followed by Viva-Voce. The Internal component will carry 30 marks (Viva Voce will be conducted by the internal teaching only, 30 Internal Assessment and 70 marks for theory).

In each paper the candidate is assessed internally by the course teacher for 30 marks comprising Internal Tests, Assignments, Seminars, Field study etc. During the  $18^{th}-20^{th}$  Week of the semester, a semester- end examination will be conducted.

In case of team work (Project work) there shall be 8 credits. The first unit may consist of identification of problem area and literature survey, the second unit may consist of study of specific literature in detail pertaining to the statement of the problem, the third unit may consist of developing a solution method logy or proposing a hypothesis to solve the problem, and fourth unit may consist of experimental analysis, results, discussions, conclusion and recommendations.

The Assignments for tutorial and practical sessions should be set by teachers based on the subject matter covered in the lecture classes. A separate set of supplementary and / or complimentary practical / tutorial exercise may also be assigned. Improvement of Marks:

The students are allowed to improve their marks only once in theory papers. No improvement of marks in IA Tests.

#### **Continuous Assessment**

The course teacher shall assess the students' performance and it is he/she who sets the question papers evaluates the answer books and grades his students. Every tutorial / practical session provides a slot in which the candidate's performance is assessed and evaluated. Transparency shall be maintained in the assessment of the students. Teachers who offer a paper shall be responsible in assessing the candidate in that paper. The evaluation of the candidate shall be based on continuous assessment.

The examination will be conducted at the Department level. The department itself conducts and evaluates the answer scripts without having a formal BOE.

The duration of semester – end theory examination will be 3 hours per paper. The question paper should be set for semester – end examination would examine the candidate's creative, comprehending, problem solving critical ability and subject knowledge.

If a candidate has not successfully completed a paper, then the candidate is automatically assumed to have dropped the course. A candidate has to re-register the dropped paper when the paper is offered again by the department if it is a compulsory paper. A candidate who is said to have dropped term work/project work has to re-register subsequently.

Under the following circumstances a candidate is said to have dropped a paper.

- 1. If a candidate has failed to obtain 75% of attendance
- 2. If a candidate decides to discontinue to study the paper
- 3. Based on continuous assessment of the candidate at the semester end examination, if the candidate is said to have been unsuccessful.
- 4. If a candidate withdraws the paper within a week after the final grades are notified, to improve the performance.
- 5. If it is not complied with University norms

### Grading system:

Grades will be given to each paper as mentioned below:

- A. Marks secured in the paper above 80%
- B. Marks secured in the paper above 79 70%
- C. Marks secured in the paper above 69-60%
- D. Marks secured in the paper above 59-50%
- E. Marks secured in the paper above 40 49%
- F. Marks secured in the paper above 40% dropped

The evaluation process is kept transparent. Learning process is made student friendly through more tutorial / practical / practice sessions and by bringing a teacher closer to student

# <u>Regulations Governing the B.A, LL.B - A Five Year Integrated Semester</u> <u>Course-</u>2022-23.

#### **Preamble**

The Bar Council of India has, by its circular No. BCI:D: 1518: 2008(LE/Rules-Part IV) dated 24.12.2008 and Cir No.1/2009 (LE) dated 27.2.2009 communicated to all the Universities requiring them to upgrade legal education by introducing integrated double degree Bachelor's Programme in law with five years learning after 10 +2 of students' career with adequate number of papers in the first degree with major and minor subjects, languages and required number of papers in law with compulsory, clinical and optional subjects. In order to give effect to the Bar Council's reformative measures and incorporate them into the University curriculum, these Regulations are enacted.

#### 1. Title

These regulations may be called as Mysore University Regulations Governing the Five Year B.A, LL.B Integrated Course 2023-24. The course shall be run under Fully Self-Financed Scheme in the Department of Studies in Law under a separate wing called School of Law, University of Mysore headed by Director, who shall be a Professor of Law appointed by the University on rotation basis to look after the academic and administrative functions.

#### 2. Commencement

These regulations shall come into force from the academic year 2023.

#### 4. Eligibility

- i) A candidate seeking admission to the B.A, LL.B Degree Course shall have passed the Pre University Course or Higher Secondary School Examination (10+2) system or an equivalent examination such as 11+1 from a recognized Board, Institution or University of India or from a foreign Institution or foreign University recognized as equivalent thereto securing in the aggregate, marks not less than 45% (in case of SC/ST 40% and OBC 42%) of the total marks. (Note: If a candidate has obtained 44.5 % or 39.5 % or 41.5% in case the category of GM, SC/ST and OBC it shall be rounded off to 45%. Or 40% or42% respectively)
- ii) The candidate shall not have completed 20 years of age as on 1<sup>st</sup> June of the year of admission. Provided that in the case of candidates belonging to SC/ST, the maximum age limit shall be 22 years as on 1<sup>st</sup> June of the year of admission. However, the restriction on age shall not be applicable to foreign nationals.
- iii) In case of foreign nationals, the candidate must have studied English language as one of the compulsory subjects in 10+2 or equivalent higher Secondary School Examination by obtaining grade or marks equivalent to 45 % in aggregate as determined by the Equivalence Committee. The Admission Committee may conduct an English language competence test if required. Only on the basis of requisite English language standard, the candidate will be provisionally admitted.

#### 5. Admission

- i) The intake capacity for the Degree Programme B.A, L.L.B shall be 60 (sixty)
- ii) Admission to the first semester of B.A, L.L.B shall be on the basis of merit as decided on the basis of marks obtained in the qualifying examination.
- iii) Reservation of seats in admission shall be done for SC/ST and Socially and Educationally Backward Classes as contemplated by the Government of Karnataka and followed by the University.
- iv) No student shall be allowed to simultaneously register for B.A, LL.B programme with any other graduate or other degree programme.
- v) There shall be no lateral entry or exit. However, transfer from similar programme of other Universities to the 3<sup>rd</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> semester is permissible subject to passing of the required papers of earlier semesters.

#### 6. Scheme of Instruction and training

The syllabus content of the papers is given in the annexure.  iii) The hours of instruction per paper per week shall be 6, conducted in day hours, and the total number of class hours per week including tutorials, moot room exercise and seminars shall be 36 hours.  iii) Each registered student shall have completed minimum of 20 weeks of internship during the entire period of legal studies (in each year not more than 4 weeks) under NGOs, Trial and Appellate Advocates, Judiciary, Legal Regulatory authorities, Legislatures and Parliament, other Legal Functionaries, Market Institutions, Law Firms, Companies and Local Self Government.

#### 6. Attendance

- i) Students are required to attend a minimum of 75% of classes in every semester.
- ii) If a student has not attended 75% of the total classes held, he/she shall be declared as disqualified and shall not be allowed to appear for the examination at the end of the semester. He shall re-register himself for the course when it is next offered.
- iii) If a candidate represents the University/State/Nation in sports, NCC, NSS, Cultural activities moot court competition or attends any programme on Legal Aid, Lok adalat, or involves in preparation of public interest litigation, he/she shall be exempted from attendance requirement to the extent of days of such participation, which shall not exceed 15 days per semester.

#### 7. Medium of Instruction

The Medium of Instruction shall be English.

#### 8.Examination

i) At the end of each semester, examination shall be conducted by the University for those students, who have fulfilled the course requirements. The written examination shall be based on problem type questions as well as descriptive answer type questions. Internal Assessment shall be completed one week earlier to the completion of instruction.

#### ii)Distribution of Marks

i) Maximum Marks: 100ii) Examination: 70

iii) Internal Assessment: 30

- iv) There shall be no retest for improvement of Internal Assessment marks.
- v) There shall be no Repeat Examination in the clinical courses (practical). However, reregistration to the concerned semester may be allowed.

#### 8. Promotion, Carryover System and Completion

- i) From a semester to subsequent semester there shall be promotion. However, there shall be no full carryover system.
- ii) The student has to complete at least first semester to get admission into fifth semester; has to complete first, second and third semesters to get admission into seventh semester; has to complete first to fifth semesters to get admission to ninth semester.
- iii) A student admitted to the B.A LL.B degree Programme shall have to pass all the prescribed and optional courses within the maximum period of ten years including the year of admission in order to be eligible for the award of the Degree, failing which he has to repeat the course.
- iv) In case of temporary discontinuance of the course, which can be opted only once in the entire course duration, within two years of discontinuance he/she shall rejoin.

#### 9. Evaluation

i) A student shall be eligible for the award of the LL.B. Degree after he/she has successfully completed all the prescribed courses in all the semesters and has secured a minimum of 40% in each paper and 45% in aggregate.

#### Regulations Governing the B.Com., LL.B - Five Years Integrated Course-2022-23.

#### **PREAMBLE**

The University of Mysore, Mysore has decided to establish a separate School of Law of National repute to commemorate its fruitful legacy of 100 years, to impart quality legal education to prepare the present generation to build a society assuring equality with human dignity.

To give the students sufficient opportunity to hear traditional lecture classes and also expose them to the real societal problems through Practical Work.

To provide opportunity for them to work with eminent jurists, practical lawyers, judicial officers, civil society organizations, administrators, industries etc., through internship programmes.

To give maximum scope for research to provide them opportunity to select a special branch of study wherein they can acquire highest degree of knowledge through seminars and dissertations and also motivate them to take up academic teaching as their carrier.

To empower them to acquire knowledge in inter disciplinary courses by encouraging them to take up short time courses in any other departments or affiliated colleges or in any of the law schools.

To create an opportunity to the teachers and students to teach and study in any of the National Law Schools in India and in Foreign Universities through entering in to Memorandum of Understanding with such Universities for teachers exchange programme and students exchange programmes.

To prepare the students suitable to the present-day market driven scenario and assist them to get better placement in Industries, Legal firms, NGO's, etc., by providing placement opportunities, the following regulations are being framed:

#### • TITLE

These regulations may be called as University of Mysore School of Law Regulations Governing the Five Years B.Com, LL.B Integrated Course. The course shall be run under Fully Self Financed Scheme in the University of Mysore under a separate wing called School of Law, University of Mysore, headed by Director, who shall be a Professor of Law appointed by the University on rotation basis to look after the academic and administrative functions.

#### • COMMENCEMENT

These regulations shall come into force from the academic year 2023-24.

#### •DURATION OF THE PROGRAMME

- 3.1 The duration of the B.Com, LL.B Programme shall be five academic years. Each academic year shall comprise of two semesters. Each semester shall consist of minimum 20 (Twenty) weeks.
- 3.2 A candidate who successfully completes the ten semesters shall be eligible for the award of B.Com, LL.B degree.

#### 4. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION

- i) A candidate seeking admission to the B.Com, LL.B Degree Course shall have passed the Pre University Course or Higher Secondary School Examination (10+2) system or an equivalent examination such as 11+1 from a recognized Board, Institution or University of India or from a foreign Institution or foreign University recognized as equivalent thereto securing in the aggregate marks not less than 45% (in case of SC/ST 40% and OBC 42%) of the total marks.
- ii) If a candidate from General Category has obtained 44.5 % or 39.5 % or 41.5% in case he belongs to the category of SC/ST it shall be rounded off to 45%. or 40% 0r 42 respectively
- iii) There shall be an entrance examination conducted at the national level for selection of candidates on the date fixed by the University. However, those who have secured highest score in the CLAT (Common Law Admission Test) Examination or any other examination conducted by any of the National Law Universities or private Universities shall also be held eligible for admission in case of insufficient number of students qualified in the University Entrance Test. However, this condition is not applicable to foreign students.
- iv) The maximum age limit for admission incase of students belongs to the General category is 20 years as on 1<sup>st</sup> June of the year of admission. In case of students belonging to SC/ST, the maximum age limit shall be 22 years as on 1<sup>st</sup> June of the year of admission. However, the restriction on age shall not be applicable to foreign nationals.
- v) In case of foreign nationals, the candidate must have studied English language as one of the compulsory subject in 10+2 or equivalent higher Secondary School Examination by obtaining grade or marks equivalent to 45 % in aggregate as determined by the Equivalence Committee. The Admission Committee may conduct an English language competence test if required. On the basis of requisite English language standard, the candidate will be provisionally admitted.

#### vi) The intake for the course shall be 60 (sixty).

- vii) Reservation of seats in admission for SC/ST and Other Backward Classes (OBC) as contemplated by the Government of Karnataka and followed by the University. In the event of non availability of the SC/ST and Other Backward Classes candidates, the students from General Category or foreign students may be admitted.
- viii) There shall be no lateral entry or exit. However, transfer from similar programme of other Universities to the 3<sup>rd</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> semester is permissible subject to the clearance of all the papers in the previous semester examinations.

#### 5. SCHEME OF INSTRUCTION AND TRAINING

- i) The medium of instruction shall be in English. The candidates are not allowed to write their examination in any other language. However, there shall be a Kannada paper for those who have studied Kannada as one of the subject in their SSLC/10<sup>th</sup> standard. For non Kannada students there shall be an optional subject viz. English/French/Hindi or any other subjects provided in the Legal Education Rules, 2008 of the Bar Council of India if 10 or more number of students enrolled for that subject otherwise, English shall be the only optional subject.
- ii) The hours of instruction per paper per week shall be 6 hours out of which 1 hour may be tutorial, conducted in day hours, and the total number of class hours per week including tutorials, moot court exercise and seminars shall be minimum of 30 hours.
- iii) Each registered student shall have completed minimum of 20 weeks of internship during the entire period of legal studies (in each year not more than 4 weeks during vacation) under NGOs, Advocates, Judiciary, Legal Regulatory Authorities, Legislature,

other Legal Functionaries, Market Institutions, Law Firms, Companies and Local Self Government or any other Authorities or Organizations notified by the Law School.

#### **6. ATTENDANCE:**

- i) Students are required to attend a minimum of 75% of classes in every semester.
- ii) If a student has not attended 75% of the total classes held, he/she shall be declared as disqualified and shall not be allowed to appear for the examination at the end of the semester. He/ She shall re-register himself/ herself for the course when it is next offered.
- iii) Provided, If a student for any exceptional reasons fail to attend 75% of the classes held in any subject, the Director of the Law School, may allow the student to take the test if the student concerned attended at least 65% of the classes held in the subject concerned and attended 75% of classes in all the subjects taken together.
- iv) If a candidate represents the University/State/Nation in sports, NCC, NSS, Cultural activities, Moot Court Competition or participated in any programmes on Legal Aid, Lok adalat, or involves in preparation of public interest litigation, he/she shall be exempted from attendance requirement to the extent of number days of such participation, which shall not exceed 15 days per semester.

#### 7. EXAMINATION

- i) At the end of each semester, examination shall be conducted by the University for those students, who have fulfilled the course requirements. The written examination shall be the combination of the both Descriptive and problem solving type. Internal Assessment examination/Practical examinations shall be completed at least 10 days prior to commencement of theory examination and these internal/practical marks shall be communicated to the University before commencement of theory examination.
- ii)Distribution of Marks
  - a) Maximum Marks: 100 b)Examination: 70
  - c) Internal Assessment: 30
- iii)Distribution of Internal Assessment

One IA test: 15Seminar: 05Assignment: 10

- iv) However, for Clinical courses I, II, III & IV, the whole 100 marks is divided as per the Bar Council of India rules i.e.,90 Marks for Records and exercises and 10 Marks for Viva-Voce.
- v) There shall be no retest for improvement in IA marks.
- vi) There shall be no Repeat Examination in the clinical courses (practical). However, reregistration to the concerned semester may be allowed.

#### 8. PROMOTION, CARRYOVER SYSTEM AND COMPLETION

i) There shall be no full carryover; the promotion to subsequent years is as per the following criteria:

The student has to complete at least first semester to get admission to the fifth semester; has to complete first, second and third semesters to get admission to seventh semester and has to complete first to fifth semesters to get admission to ninth semester.

ii) The maximum duration to complete the B.Com.,LL.B degree is ten years i.e., double the duration. A student admitted to the B.Com LL.B degree Programme shall have to pass all the

prescribed and optional courses within the maximum period of ten years including the year of admission in order to be eligible for the award of the Degree, failing which he has to repeat the course

iv) In case of temporary discontinuance of the course, which can be opted only once in the entire course duration, within two years of discontinuance he/she shall take re-admission.

#### 9. EVALUATION

i) A student shall be eligible for the award of the Bcom.LL.B. Degree after he/she has successfully completed all the prescribed courses in all the semesters and has secured a minimum of 40% in each paper and 45% in aggregate.

ii) The award of classes and grades shall be as under:

a) 70% and more First Class with Distinction [O]

b) 60% and above but less than 70% First Class [A]
c) 50% and above but less than 60% Second Class [B+]
d) 45% and above but less than 50% Pass Class [B]

- iii) A candidate who is failed to get passing marks has to apply for revaluation or challenge valuation within fifteen days from the date of announcement of result/within 5 days from the date of receipt of Marks Statement.
- iv) A candidate who has failed to get a minimum of 40 per cent is allowed to take repeat examination when the University conducts the examination. The re-examination shall be held for odd semesters only during fresh examination for odd semester and for even semester only during fresh examination to even semester.
- v) A candidate desirous of improving his percentage in any of the papers is allowed to take examination for improving his position subject to the condition stated in the regulation *iv* above.
- vi) Examinations of odd semesters shall be conducted only at the end of odd semesters and examinations of even semesters shall be conducted only at the end of even semesters.

#### 10. TEACHERS AND STUDENTS EXCHANGE PROGRAMME:

- i) The Law School can enter into an agreement with any of the reputed Law Schools, National Law Schools and Foreign Universities for Teachers and Students exchange programme.
- ii) Academicians from foreign Universities can teach in Law School in any of the specialized subject / subjects for such specialized papers the students have to pay separate fee as prescribed by the Law School.
- iii) The travelling, hostel and other incidental expenditures shall be borne by the concerned students only. However, the expenses are subject to the conditions to the mutual agreement between Law School and Foreign Universities.

#### 11. PLACEMENT CELL:

i) To accelerate placement activities a separate placement cell shall be established through appointing a qualified person in-charge of the cell or any of the teachers may be given additional

charge of it. The workload of such teacher shall be reduced as decided in the Department Council Meeting.

ii) The person in charge of placement cell shall coordinate with Law firms, Industries both public and private and other prospective employers and make arrangement for campus interview.

#### 12. ESTABLISHMENT OF SPECIAL CHAIR, LEGAL AID CLINICS AND CELLS:

- i) It shall be the constant endeavor of the Law School in consultation with the University of Mysore in getting financial assistance from the University Grants Commission, Ministry of Human Resource Development or private organizations or from any industry to establish a separate branch of study through establishing a separate chair like consumer chair, Good Governance and RTI Chair, Mental Health Chair, International Study Chair etc.,
- ii) A Professor / Associate Professor having specialization in the field shall be the in charge of such chairs established in consultation with the sponsoring organization.
- iii) There shall be a Legal Aid Clinic, Alternate Dispute Resolution Cell, Consumer Cell and other Clinics/Cells may be established as recommended by the Department Council.
- iv) The Course Teacher shall be the in charge of these specialized cells.

#### 13. ESTABLISHMENT OF THE LAW FORUM:

To organize Special Lectures, Endowment Lectures, National and International Seminars and Moot Court Competitions there shall be a Law Forum which can coordinate with University Authorities and Public from different walks of life under the Chairmanship of the Director and all other faculty as members. There shall be a convener appointed for this purpose or any full time teacher may be in-charge to look after the activities of the Law Forum.

#### 14. MISCELLANEOUS

Any matter not envisaged above shall be resolved by the Vice-Chancellor in consultation with the appropriate bodies of the University, which shall be final and binding.
