As per the provisions of the regulations governing CBCS every department has nominated one faculty member as mentor and CBCS coordinator. The responsibilities of the CBCS coordinator include both academic and stress related counseling to the students in their respective departments. Most problems related to choice of the courses, selection of open electives, dropping of courses/semester are decided by the students in consultation with the CBCS coordinator. Students discuss their difficulties and study related problems also with the coordinator. The issues that cannot be addressed by the coordinator would be referred to the chairperson of the department who takes an appropriate decision in consultation with department council. The mentoring system is periodically reviewed by the CBCS committee headed by the Chief Nodal Officer, CBCS.
