Fieldwork and Case Study (Dissertation)

A dissertation of about 50 to 75 pages should be prepared under the guidance of a supervisor and the same is submitted. The study may be conducted on any enterprise, an institution, a bank, a village, a community or a tribal community. Fieldwork is undertaken to study the function, progress, academic and cultural aspects of the above-mentioned entities.

In the viva-voce evaluation may be done on fieldwork experience, grasp of the subject and communicative skills.

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
