

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

between

Tallinn University of Technology (Estonia)

and

University of Mysore (India)

In accordance with a mutual desire to promote collaboration between Tallinn University of Technology (TalTech) and University of Mysore, India (UoM), both institutions enter into this Memorandum of Understanding on research, education and cultural cooperation.

Tallinn University of Technology (TalTech), represented by Vice-Rector for Research **Professor Renno Veinthal**, and University of Mysore represented by Vice Chancellor, **Professor G. Hemantha Kumar**, agree with the following:

The Parties agree to collaborate in the following relevant areas:

1. Exchange of staff and technologies for the purpose of working in related areas of science technologies; cooperate to apply research programs of International organizations or International cooperation projects of the two governments of mutual interests.
2. The establishment of joint curricula that matches the specifications and requirements of your university and the Association of Indian Universities.
3. Jointly organize bilateral or multilateral conferences, symposia, seminars and other scientific meetings on related science and technology research topics of mutual interest.
4. Exchange of materials and information relating to those scientific areas in which the Parties have mutual interests.

5. Exchange of University lecturers, scientists, postgraduates and students for studying and doing research.
6. Other ways that can help for cooperation.

No financial commitment and/or any other commitment or liability by either party is to be implied from this memorandum of understanding.

Cooperation in specific areas and details will be implemented upon mutual agreement and will be outlined in a separate agreement on cooperation or addendum to this Memorandum upon its signature by the authorized representatives.

Both Parties agree that all financial issues, necessary to implement this Memorandum will be negotiated and will be subject to the availability of funds.

Both Parties agree to seek possibilities for funding from both public and private sources in support of their joint interests.
