### Report of Field visit and workshop organized at the Prehistoric site of Doddamolathe, Kodagu district, Karnataka on 19-02-2021.

On 19-02-2021, a one day field visit cum workshop was conducted by the Department of Studies in Ancient History and Archaeology at the prehistoric site of Doddamolathe in Somwarpet taluk of Kodagu district. Since Doddamolathe is a centrally protected site, i.e. under the protection of the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI), this program was done in association with the ASI, Bengaluru Circle, Bengaluru. The main objective of this program was to provide an overview of Iron Age-Megalithic burials in India in general and Karnataka in particular. A total of 25 students of MA and Ph.D. participated in this workshop in addition to the permanent and temporary faculty of the Department. Shri Sunil (Conservation assistant, ASI, Bengaluru circle) and Dr. V. Shobha (assistant professor, Department of studies in Ancient History and Archaeology) co-ordinated the visit on behalf of ASI and the Department respectively.

The Iron Age-megalithic burials (dolmens) at Doddamolathe are situated atop a small hillock, located in a valley with thick vegetation cover. The team reached the site at about 10.30 am and was welcomed by Shri Guru Bagi (Assistant Superintending Archaeologist, ASI, Srirangapatna) and Dr. Sujana Stephen (Assistant Archaeologist, ASI, Bengaluru circle). At the site, Dr. Sujana gave a detailed talk on Iron Age of India and the typology of Megalithic burials found in India, which was followed by interaction and discussion with Dr. Sujana and Shri Guru Bagi. Chandan Kumar D.M., a former student of the department introduced the students to the features of the burials at Doddamolathe in light of his dissertation work on megalithic burial sites of Kodagu district. The students then examined each of the 50-odd burials and became familiar with the techniques of constructing such burials. They were also taught about the method of documenting Iron Age-megalithic burial sites.

On the way back to Mysore, the team halted at another megalithic site, viz. Heggadehalli (Somwarpet taluk, Kodagu district), where excavations of burials were done by our Department as well as State Department of Archaeology in the 1970s and 90s respectively. There are just a few faint traces of burials at this site, where more than 500 burials once existed. This was helpful in understanding the current state of archaeological sites across the nation and how such sites may be identified and documented.
