BACKGROUND OF THE CONFERENCE:

Urban areas are generally regarded as epicenters of higher opportunities and productivity, serving as the vehicle for accelerating economic growth and regional development. However, the existing urban environment in India whether physical, economic, social or infrastructural are facing a challenge to provide a healthy quality of life and a respectable standard of living as seen in the lack of proper housing, infrastructure, waste management, air and water pollution, outbreak of diseases, urban poverty, rising crimes especially against women and children, gender development gap, lack of integrated rural- urban development etc. Thus both physical and nonphysical environments of urban areas have become a cause of concern for urban planning, environmental planning, and integrated rural-urban development and planning. Data shows that for every two seconds an Indian from a rural area moves to a city in search of a better life that works out to 30 Indians every minute, which is a massive movement every day. By 2047, close to 65 percent of all Indians will be living in urban conglomerations. That means India must provide an urban way of life for at least 800 million Indians in the near to mid-term. This massive urban migration can either be an intractable problem or an opportunity to transform India.

According to the 2012 report of the Technical Group on Urban Housing Shortage for the 12th Plan (TG-12), reveals that the total number of households living in housing poverty was around 18.78 million. Data shows that as per the Census of India 2011, only 71.2% of the urban population has access to drinking water within the premises and only 20.7% of the population has access to Drinking Water near the premises. None of the cities have 24x7 water supplies. The census data shows that 32.7% of the urban population has access to a piped sewer system and 12.6% of the urban population still defecates in the open. According to the NSSO report (2019), an estimated 12.2 percent of urban households rely on bottled water for their drinking water needs up from 2.7 percent 10 years ago. Against this background, the core rationale of the proposed seminar is an attempt to have solid discourse on various problems being faced by the urban excluded sections and also to suggest suitable policy measures to be implemented soon. This seminar will provide a common platform for the current discussion, sharing ideas, exploring reasons for inequality, social exclusion, financial exclusion, poverty, lack of basic infrastructural facilities, environmental issues etc. Against this background, the core rationale of the proposed seminar is an attempt to have solid discourse on various problems being faced by the urban excluded sections and also to suggest suitable policy measures to be implemented soon. This seminar will provide a common platform for the current discussion, sharing ideas, exploring reasons for inequality, social exclusion, financial exclusion, poverty, lack of basic infrastructural facilities, etc.
