19. Syllabus :

Japanese Language Level 3 is designed to consolidate the correct pronunciation and intonation and the writing of Japanese characters learned at Japanese Level 2. Advanced Japanese grammar is introduced in this course. It also equips students with the ability to use the language in conversation with others

The students are expected to consolidate the phonetic system of Chinese, including the sounds, the tones and the intonation; The students are expected to have an understanding of advance level Japanese grammar and Japanese characters. The students will be able to recognize 500 Japanese characters and 500 Japanese phrases and expressions after the course. On completion of this course, students should be able to consolidate the pronunciation of Japanese and be familiar with the phonetic system of Japanese and to recognize 500 common Japanese phrases and expression, and master 500 Japanese characters, including the meaning and usage of characters;
