19. Syllabus :

Chinese Language Level 2 is designed to consolidate the correct pronunciation and intonation and the writing of Chinese characters learned at Chinese Level 1. Intermediate level Chinese grammar is introduced in this course. It also equips students with the ability to use the language in day-to-day life

The students are expected to consolidate the phonetic system of Chinese, including the sounds, the tones and the intonation. The students are expected to have an understanding of intermediate level Chinese grammar and Chinese characters. On completion of this course, students should be able to consolidate the pronunciation of Chinese and be familiar with the phonetic system of Chinese and to recognize 300 common Chinese phrases and expression, and master 300 Chinese characters, including the meaning and usage of characters;
