



1.3. Faculty of Commerce:

A) Bachelor of Commerce(B.Com)(6 Semesters/3 years)

B) Bachelor of Business Management (B.B.M.) (6 Semesters/3 years)

2.0 Eligibility for admission

2.1 B.A., B.Sc., B.Com., B.B.M., B.S.W., B.P.A. B.Sc.(F.C.Sc.) A candidate who has passed the two year pre-university examination conducted by the Pre-university Board of Education in the State of Karnataka or any other examination considered as equivalent thereto by the University is eligible for admission to the 1st Semester of the course. For B.Sc. course only students completing PUC or its equivalent examination with Science subjects are eligible.

2.2. B.P.A. A candidate should have passed.

- i. PUC with relevant Fine Arts subject (as optional) OR
- ii. PUC and Pass in Junior Examination in relevant subject conducted by Karnataka State Government OR
- iii. PUC and Pass in aptitude test conducted by the College in the concerned subject.

- 2.3 (a) Students who have passed any JOC (10+2) are eligible to join I Semester B.A.
- (b) Students who have passed JOC in Sericulture are eligible to join I Semester B.Sc. with sericulture as one of the Optionals
- (c) Students who have passed the following JOC (10+2) are eligible to join I Semester Degree course as detailed hereunder :

- (d) i) A Candidate who has passed 3 years Diploma in Commercial or Secretarial Practice conducted by Department of Technical Education, Government of Karnataka is eligible for admission to III Semester B.Com./B.B.M directly. However, such a candidate has to pass the languages and other Compulsory Papers Viz., Constitution of India and Environmental Studies of first Two Semesters. Such candidate will not be subjected to any IA in these papers. However, for eventual calculation 80 marks is equated to 100 marks.
- ii) A Candidate who has passed 2 years Diploma in Business Administration conducted by Department of Technical Education, Government of Karnataka is eligible for admission to V Semester B.B.M. / B.Com. degree course subject to the condition that the candidate has to pass papers in languages and all compulsory papers of first Four Semesters B.B.M. / B.Com. Such candidate will not be subjected to any IA in these papers. However, for eventual calculation 80 marks is equated to 100 marks.

3.0 Scheme of Instruction

3.1 (a) For all courses (except B.Com & B.B.M):

- (i) In First Semester there shall be 6 Papers viz., 2 languages, Constitution of India and 3 optional subjects,
- (ii) In Second Semester there shall be 6 Papers viz., 2 languages, Environmental Studies and 3 optional subjects.

- (iii) In III Semester there shall be 5 papers viz., 2 languages and 3 optional subjects.
 - (iv) In IV Semester there shall be 6 papers viz., 2 languages, Computer Application and 3 optional subjects.
 - (v) In V & VI Semester there shall be 3 optionals, each optional having 3 papers.
- (b) For B.Com / B.B.M. Course in all the six semesters, there shall be 6 papers each. In the first 4 Semesters there shall be 2 language papers and 3 core/allied papers each and one Compulsory paper (Constitution of India in I Semester, Environmental Studies in II Semester and Computer Application in III & IV Semesters) respectively. However, B.Com students shall study Computer Fundamental in III Semester and Computer Application in IV Semester.
- 3.2 The Syllabus for optional subjects or for optional papers shall be divided into 3 to 6 units depending on the number of teaching hours per week and nature of the subject/paper and decided by the respective Board of Studies.
- 3.3 For languages the first three units shall be for general literature and the remaining one unit shall be for language component. The general literature may be changed from time to time, whereas the language component shall remain the same.

3.4 Hours of instruction (Contact hours) per week.

(a) For B.A./B.Sc. Courses:

- i) I to IV Semester languages - 4 hours
- ii) Optional Subjects with Practical components ; Theory- 3 hours and Practical - 3 hours
- iii) In case of Non-practical subjects: 6 hours (for optionals)
- iv) For V and VI Semesters, each subject will have 3 optional papers with 3 hours of teaching and for subject with practical Components there shall be 02 Theory papers and 01 Practical of 4 hours of instruction per week.

b) For B.Com./B.B.M. Courses:

For all the Core papers, the hours of instruction per paper shall be 6 hours per week.

For all allied / language papers, the hours of instruction shall be 4 hours per week.

4.0 Attendance :

- 4.1 Each semester shall be taken as a unit for purpose of calculating attendance and a student shall be considered to have put in the required attendance for the Semester, if he/she has attended not less than 75% of the number of working hours/periods in each paper/periods in each paper/subject in each semester.

4.2 Shortage of attendance up to 15% (i.e.60% or more but less then 75%) may be condoned by the Vice-Chancellor on the recommendation of the Principal of the College on payment of Fee prescribed by the University. There shall be no condonation if attendace is below 60% during any semester, for any reason.

4.3 A candidate who does not satisfy the requirement of attendance shall not be eligible to take examination of the concerned semester, nor is eligible to get admission to the next semester.

4.4 A candidate who fails to satisfy the requirement of attendance in a semester shall repeat that semester when offered in the immediate subsequent year. This facility shall be available only for TWO times in the entire course.

4.5 In the case of a candidate who represents his/her institution/University, Karnataka State/Nation in Sports/NCC/NSS/CuHural or any Official activities shortage of attendance upto a maximum of 15 days in a Semester may be condoned, based on the recommendation and prior permission of the Head of the Institution concerned.

5.0 Medium of Instruction:

5.1 The medium of instruction shall be English or Kannada. A candidate may write the examination of the entire paper either in English or in Kannada. This does not apply to languages.

6.0 Subjects of Study:

6.1 B.A., B.Sc., degree candidates shall select any 03 optional subjects as approved by the Board of Studies as per the Regulation 1.1 and 1.2.

6.2 For. B.Com., B.B.M., B.S.W., B.P.A, B.Sc.(F.C.Sc.) the respective Board of Studies shall determine the number of Compulsory and optional Subjects.

6.3 Students of all degree courses shall study compulsory subject: Constitution of India in the 1st Semester, Environmental Studies in the Second Semester & Computer Application in the III/IV Semester.

6.4 A candidate shall study any TWO of the languages viz., English, Kannada, Hindi, Sanskrit, Urdu, Telugu, Tamil, Malayalam, Persian, Arabic French, German, Russian.

Note: 1. Out of the two languages selected, one of the languages shall be an Indian Language. However, in case of foreign nationals, the requirement of an Indian language may be waived by the University.

2. Indian Language means any one of the languages mentioned in VIII Schedule of the Constitution.

3. The University may permit private study of a language by a student, if there is no provision for instruction in that subject in a college and allow him/her to appear for the examination in the subject without insisting on attendance. Such candidate will not be subjected to any IA marks. However, for eventual calculation 80 marks equated to 100 marks.
4. Deaf and Dumb, Spastic, Mentally Retarded and Learning deficiency students shall offer any one language.

7.0 Maximum Duration for passing the entire Course:

- 7.1 The Candidate shall pass the Degree within double the duration of the course.

8.0 Appearance for the Examination

- 8.1 A candidate shall apply for all the papers of a semester when he/she appears for the examination of that semester for the first time.

9.0 Examination

- 9.1 There shall be a University examination at the end of each semester.
- 9.2 Every theory paper shall comprise of as many parts as there are units in the syllabus.

Note: Every Board of Studies shall prepare the Model question paper in every Subject/Paper.

10.0 Break-up of marks for Theory and Practical papers:

- 10.1 For papers having practicals, for 1 to IV Semesters, the break-up of marks is 70+30, out of which 70 marks for Theory and 30 mark for Practical. Out of 70 marks, 60 for paper(writing) and 10 for IA. Out of 30 marks for practical, 20 marks for practical
10 marks shall be IA/practical record. Preparation of practical record is compulsory.
For
Practical in V & VI Semesters, marks shall be 100, out of which 80 marks for practical in each Semester/Examination, 20 marks for IA and Practical record.
- 10.2 The Syllabus for practical shall be as prescribed by BOS from time to time.
- 10.3 The practical examination shall be conducted with both internal and external examiners.

11.0 QUESTION PAPER SETTING, VALUATION

- 11.1 Question Paper setting :

There may be separate Board of Examiners for each subject for Preparing, scrutinising and approving the question papers and Schemes of valuation.

11.2 Coding of Answer Scripts:

Before validation the answer scripts shall be coded using false numbers, for each paper code separate false number shall be given.

11.3 Valuation:

There shall be single valuation of the answer scripts.

12.0 Photocopy of Answer scripts, Seeing, Retotalling and Revaluation.

12.1 A candidate who desires to apply for Photo copy of his/her theory answer script, may do so by paying the prescribed fee and submitting prescribed application directly to the Registrar (Evaluation) within the date, as specified from time to time.

13.0 A candidate who desires to apply for:

1. Retotalling
2. Seeing and Retotalling
3. Revaluation
4. Seeing and Revaluation

of his/her theory answer script, may do so by paying the prescribed fee and by submitting the prescribed application, along with the relevant original marks card to the Registrar (Evaluation), through the Principal of the concerned College/Institution, within the date as notified from time to time by the University.

Provided that there shall not be provision for only seeing.

13.1 The Retotalling shall provide for checking whether all the answers have been valued and whether the totaling is correct. In case any answer or part thereof has not been valued, that part may be referred to another valuer, and marks so awarded shall be added to the total. In case there is any mistake in totaling or carryover of marks from the inside sheets to the facing sheet, the Registrar (Evaluation) may have it corrected with the approval of the vice-chancellor.

13.2 The result of Retotalling shall be announced within 20 days from the last date fixed for receipt of applications.

13.3 The result of revaluation shall be announced within 30 days from the last date fixed for receipt of applications.

13.4 In general, revaluation shall be got done out-side the jurisdiction of the university. However, under inevitable circumstance an internal valuer, who has not valued that particular paper, may do the revaluation.

- 13.5
- a. If the difference between the original marks and the revaluation marks does not exceed 15 percent of the maximum marks prescribed for that Theory paper, the average of the two marks shall be the final award.
 - b. If the difference between the original marks and the revaluation marks is more than 15 percent of the maximum prescribed for that theory Paper, such scripts shall be got valued by another external examiner. The average of the nearest two shall be the final award of marks.
 - c. In case where one or more answers are not valued by the original Valuer, then the marks awarded by the subsequent valuer, as far as these answers are concerned, shall be taken as they are, without Averaging with the marks of the other answers.

13.6 In cases where the difference between the original marks, first revaluation marks or/and the second revaluation marks clearly indicate that a particular examiner has been erratic in his/her valuation, then such cases shall be referred to the "Malpractice and Lapses Inquiry committee" to establish whether or not any valuer has been erratic in his/her evaluation, and to recommend if the committee so desires, any punitive measures.

13.7 If there is a complaint of a serious nature, of erratic or unfair valuation in any paper for a group of candidates, the vice-chancellor may after a preliminary inquiry, order for special valuation of the concerned group of or entire set of candidates in the paper concerned. After such special valuation, a random sample of 10% of the answer scripts, subject to a minimum of 10, shall be referred for review.

13.8 The provision for gracing shall also apply to such candidates after retotaling and revaluation. However the grace marks shall be shown separately in marks ledger and not in marks card.

14.0 Classification of successful candidates

14.1 Minimum for a pass in each paper (theory and Practical put together) shall be 40% provided minimum for pass in theory component shall be 30%. Provided further for a paper without the theory component, minimum for pass shall also be 40%.

- a) The candidate shall take both Theory and Practical examinations together. Minimum for a pass in each paper (Theory and Practical put together) shall be 40%
- b) The candidate shall take examinations in both the components together.

14.2 For declaration of First Class with Distinction/First Class/Second Class, the aggregate of the total marks secured by a candidate (including repeaters) in all the semesters put together shall be considered as detailed below:

75% and above	- First Class with Distinction
60% & above but below 75%	- First Class
50% & above but below 60%	- Second Class
40% & above but below 50%	- Pass Class

14.3 There shall not be any declaration of Rank.

15.0 Provision for Repeaters

15.1 A candidate is allowed to carry all the previous unleared papers to the subsequent semesters. However, the candidate should clear all the papers within double, the duration of the course.

a) The Candidate shall take both Theory and Practical examinations together. Minimum for a pass in each paper(Theory and Practical put together) shall be 40%.

b) The candidate shall take examinations in both the components together.

15.2 In case of Bachelor of Social Work, candidates failing in filed work shall reaper that semester with respect to that iieldwork only.

15.3 Such of those candidates who have discontinued the course/failed to take admission to the next semester, shall get admitted to the concerned semester in the immediate next academic year only. This provision is available to a student only two times in the entire duration of the course.

15.4 Examination shall be conducted for all semesters at the end of every semester.

15.5 A candidate is permitted to apply for rejection of result of all Papers of the entire semester within 30 days from the date of declaration of results of that semester. However, a candidate can reject result only once in the entire course.

15.6 The Repeaters are eligible for declaration of class as in 14.2

5.0 Award of grace marks:

16.1. Grace Marks shall be awarded to a Paper [Theory/Practical/Viva-Voce/ Head of Passing (Aggregate)] to a maximum of 2% per paper/subject, if, after gracing, the candidate gets minimum prescribed marks in the Theory/Practical/Viva-Voce and passes in the paper/subject. The maximum grace marks permissible in an examination (Or unit) shall not exceed 10 marks.

16.2 A candidate shall be eligible to a maximum of 5 grace marks, provided the candidate :

- Continued
- a. Appears for the entire examination (all subjects);
 - b. He/she has failed in only one subject [Theory/Practical/Viva-Voce/Head of Passing (Aggregate)] of the examination.
 - c. Passes the whole examination by such gracing; and
 - d. Gets the minimum prescribed marks in the Theory/Practical/Viva-Voce and Head of Passing (Aggregate) for passing by such gracing.

5.3. **Class Improvement:** Gracing shall also be done for the purpose of declaring class (First Class with Distinction, First Class and Second Class) on the following guidelines:

- a. For an examination with a maximum of 500 Marks or less there shall be a gracing of TWO MARKS only.

- b. If the maximum marks prescribed for an examination is more than 500 marks, every unit of 500 marks or a part thereof shall be graced by ONE MARK. However, such gracing shall not exceed Four Marks in all.

Upto a maximum of 500 marks : 2 marks

Between 501-1000 marks (maximum) : 3 marks

Above 1000 marks (maximum):4 marks

- c. A candidate is entitled to gracing (maximum permissible for that examination) even if he/she is appearing for the examination, by claiming exemptions of exemptions.

16.4 Gracing under GMR 01 and GMR 02 together is not permissible in the same examination.

16.5 Grace Marks awarded for passing a subject/whole examination/for class improvement shall be shown only in the ledger.

16.6 Any fraction in the calculation of percentage of grace marks as above may be rounded off to the next digit.

16.7 In case of a tie, a candidate who secures marks without grace or less grace is preferred ranking/ awarding Prizes/Medals.

These provisions are not applicable to such of the examinations wherever the gracing is regulated by any central act.

17.0 Any other issue not envisaged above shall be resolved by the Vice-Chancellor in consultation with the appropriate Bodies.



Hence, Rule No. 16.8 (addition) to the said regulations as stated below is here by notified.

Rule No 16.8 - Such of the candidates:

- a) Who have completed the I Yr. (1st Semester/2nd Semester) course & have passed at least 50% of the papers, in the parent University are eligible for admission to II yr. (3rd Semester, subsequent semester/year), course with the condition that they should pass all the un cleared papers of I Yr. in accordance with the Mysore University scheme.
- b) Who have passed all the papers of I Yr. (1st semester / 2nd semester) exam. in the parent University are eligible for admission to II Yr. (3rd Semester) by retaining the results of I Yr. (1st and 2nd semester) of the parent University.
- c) Who have completed II Yr.(3rd / 4th semester) course and have passed all the papers of the I Yr.(1st and 2nd semester) and at least 50% of the papers of the II Yr.(3rd and 4th semester) of the parent University are eligible for admission to III Yr.(5th semester) course with the condition that they should pass all the un cleared papers of II Yr.(3rd and 4th semester) in accordance with the Mysore University Scheme.
- d) Who have completed the I (1st semester/2nd semester) and II Yr. 3rd semester and 4th semester) courses and examinations in the parent University are eligible for admission to III Yr. (5th semester) by retaining the results of the I (1st semester and 2nd semester) and II Year (3rd semester and 4th semester) of the parent University.



2. If a candidate gets admitted to more than one course except as provided in Regulation 1 above the University shall cancel without giving prior notice his/her admission to both the Courses to which he/she has joined.

1. No student admitted to a degree ^{course} in a College or Department of Studies under the jurisdiction of this University shall be permitted to study simultaneously in any other course leading to a Degree (Regular, Evening, Morning or Correspondence) offered by this University.
2. If a candidate gets admitted to more than one course, the University shall cancel without giving prior notice his /her admission to both the courses to which he/she has joined.
